


MEMO ANNOUNCEMENT

LETTER FROM THE DE'S DESK



I PLANTED, Apollos watered, but God caused it to grow....The one who plants and the one who water work as one, but each will receive his reward according to his work. We are coworkers belonging to God. -1 Corinthians 3:6, 8-9a

I grow a lot of my own food. For years, I've started most of my plants from seed under my grow lights. This year, for some inexplicable reason, my germination rates were very poor, and seedlings that did germinate struggled. I'm keeping and using every

viable plant I can keep, but I've had to resort to something I almost *never* do ... visit a plant nursery and buy someone else's plant starts (gasp!).

I grow food to save money. Have you seen the cost of produce in the grocery store lately? (Another gasp!) I don't want to pay \$7 for a head of cabbage when I can pay Zero Dollars at my local public library seed swap and grow my own. This week I had to break down and purchase a 6-cell collection of cabbage starts. I paid \$3.50 for them, and have already planted them out in one of my raised beds. \$3.50 for six is still less expensive than \$7 for one, so I can't complain too much.

As I nurture the plants this season, and harvest them in a couple of months, I'll not forget which plants came from my own seed and which came from someone else's seed. I'll know that my varieties are always heirloom and nursery varieties are often not. I'll know that mine came from my effort and the others are the product of someone else's time, care, and resources.

You know what? Whether I started the plants, or the Mennonite family that runs Weaver's Nursery did, for the duration of the growing season, it will still be God who brings the growth. I'll be depending on the Lord to send rain, to safeguard from extreme conditions, to provide enough sunlight, to bring the pollinators. Everything those plants need to survive and thrive will be God's responsibility.

The same holds for our church members when they are on mission: Our responsibility is to take the Gospel with us as we are going on our way, always prepared whether conditions are favorable or unfavorable, always ready to provide an answer for the hope we profess, always willing to offer prayer, encouragement, an invitation, an admonition, and a blessing. We do not save anyone with our words or actions, we do not "win souls" to pad our numbers or give ourselves bragging rights.



According to Paul in 1 Corinthians 3, we partner with each other and with God: We do our part of representing Christ as His ambassadors, and God's Holy Spirit stirs the hearer and the watcher and prompts them to respond. I may be the one planting the seed, I may be the one nurturing another believer's seed that has been planted through my ministry, but God ultimately brings the harvest of a new believer, a newly baptized brother or sister, a new church member, a new disciple, a new Christian friend.

God is depending on us to do our part, to participate as workers together in the field of harvest: Plant the seeds of the Good News, have your testimony ready and available; nurture the seeker, disciple them, guide them into the truth. Then watch and pray as God brings the growth and expands His kingdom and reign.


WMMTP (West Marva Ministry Training Program) has updated its fee structure to simplify the way current and prospective students pay their portion to participate. Moving forward, all students will pay an **annual fee of only \$75** beginning with the first class of the fiscal year, usually early February. This covers registration for quarterly classes, including a stipend for the teaching staff.

Classes are open to all pastors and laypersons, ministry inquirers, anyone who wants to develop more Bible knowledge or ministry skill. Continuing Education Units available.

Registration for both delegates and non-delegates

for the Church of the Brethren Annual Conference

will open at 12:00 Noon Central Time on Wednesday, March 5, 2025.

- The advance delegate registration fee is \$350 per delegate. Advance registration will close on June 10. The fee for

registering delegates onsite in Greensboro will be \$425. Don't wait!

- The advance non-delegate registration fee is \$175. Advance registration will close on June 10. The fee for registering non-delegates onsite in Greensboro will be \$210.
- Registering as a Virtual Non-Delegate to watch business online, participate in a number of Equipping Sessions and see the Rockingham Male Chorus concert Saturday night is again an option. The advance virtual non-delegate registration fee is \$195 through June 27. There is also an option for Groups and Institutions to participate virtually from a common location for \$500. Registering a Delegate Congregations may register their delegates using online registration beginning Wednesday, March 5, 2025 at 12:00 Noon Central Time. Payment options include paying by credit card or sending a check. Go to www.brethren.org/ac and click on the "Registration" button and then choose "Delegate Registration". Each delegate's complete name, address, email, and phone number are required. If you need assistance, call the Annual Conference Office (847-429-4366) and we will be happy to answer your questions. Delegate registration fees provide each delegate with a Conference booklet, the business materials packet, a designated delegate name tag, and seating at the delegate tables at Annual Conference. Each congregation who registers a delegate or delegates will also receive a copy of the 2025 Annual Conference minutes.
